EXPO 2018 competition guidelines

- **BEST ATTENDED SCHOOL** will receive a \$100 Amazon gift certificate.

- **TRIVIA COMPETITION:** If there is interest, we will implement a school trivia competition. Your school will need a team of 1-4 students to answer questions on languages, culture, geography, etc. Winning team will receive an amazon gift certificate, and much-deserved pride. Teams must contact Marina Peters-Newell by Friday, Feb. 16 at mpnewell@unm.edu to compete. **2017 winner: Las Cruces HS!**
- **POSTER COMPETITION:** Anyone can enter! It must depict the theme “What does a global citizen look like?” Maximum size: 24” x 30”, to be submitted by 10 a.m., Saturday, March 3 (Ortega hall 3rd floor hallway). If you are a student, your name, as well as the name of the class teacher, school, e-mail and tel. no. of the teacher must be affixed to the back of the poster. All media and languages are accepted. The posters will be judged on-site. First place, 2nd place, and popular vote will all receive amazon gift certificates. **2017 winner: La Cueva HS!**
- **CHALK ART COMPETITION:** (weather permitting) At 11 a.m., we will begin the Chalk art competition, just southeast of the duck pond. This can be done individually or as a group. Each participant/participating group will receive different colors of sidewalk chalk, and will be given 20 minutes to create a picture/graphic depicting the theme “What does a global citizen look like?” The winner/winning group will receive a prize. **2017 winner: St Pius X!**
- **HAIKU COMPETITION:** This is an on-site contest, 25 min. in length. The haiku must be written in a language **other than English**. It must be completely original, written during the contest time, incorporating a particular theme that will be announced at the competition. An English translation must also be provided (but the translation doesn’t have to be a haiku)

Contest Submission Example (Latin):

Dīcēbātur me	(5 syllables) (<i>It has been said that I</i>)
cupere scrīptitāre	(7 syllables) (<i>like to repetitively write</i>)
certāminibus	(5 syllables) (<i>in competitions</i>)

A note to teachers: for proof of participation in the Expo, students will submit completed passports (= 4 sessions). Please remind students that 1 session = 30 min, so 4 sessions will require at least 2 hrs of participation, and the last session is 12 – 12:30. Students are welcome to come for just 1 specific session, but this will not result in a completed passport.
